The children loved to decorate a Christmas tree with little bells; they also decorated a Christmas wreath with pom poms following the pattern white/red. And of course we listened to Christmas carols and sang them, too! The children were learning “Jingle bells” and “We wish you a merry Christmas”.

On Friday the children had a blast! We made waffles from scratch...and again all the toddlers were very good helpers and great observers. They really love when we prepare food in the classroom. Another holiday was introduced this week. The children were told that some people in the world celebrate Kwanzaa to give thanks for the good harvest; they light up candles of different colors; they share presents and food. Kwanzaa lasts for one week.

Just a reminder that, per SMA Health Policy, a child can not come to school if he/she has one of the following conditions:

- Temperature of 100 degrees or higher.
- Severe coughing.

- Diarrhea (more than one abnormal loose stool within a 24 hour period)
- Pink eye.
- Untreated infected skin patches.
- Excessive yellow/green mucus.
- Vomiting.
