Happy Friday Mulberry parents!

I am sure you were checking your child's folder every day and having an idea of what's our routine throughout the day.

Our presentations so far are as follows:-

Sensorial: - The Mulberry friends are grading the pink tower from biggest to smallest, Red rods from largest to shortest, primary colors – Red, Yellow and blue. They are familiar with these colors but are also learning that one cannot make these colors by mixing any other color. Artists create all the colors of rainbow by mixing together the primary colors.

Science: - Our students are amazed to find out about the variety of the types of apples and how they taste different. It also reflects in the art category by making their own apple either by gluing or push pinning. Push pinning is a very important step to learn how to hold a pencil.

Practical life: -The kids are introduced to whole hand transfer, pouring, spooning, stringing, and how to use a clothespin. As well as how to roll-unroll rug, hold tray with two careful hands and other basic skills that one needs to use for life time.
